I am writing because I disagree with how your administration is approaching academic restructuring. While I understand that there is a budget deficit, gutting the liberal arts and sciences is a short-sighted plan that will tarnish our academic reputation and harm students. This has been a rushed process and student and faculty voices are being ignored. I urge you to slow down this budget analysis, listen to faculty and students, consider alternative ways of cutting costs, and preserve Lydia Moss Bradley's vision for this institution.

If fewer students enroll or stay at Bradley, the budget deficit will only grow larger. This is not a sustainable or sensible path forward.
